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With the death of a loved one comes the realization that there are many important family matters to be settled, and many business and financial decisions to be made. To assist the person who is called upon to settle the estate of the deceased relative or friend, we have compiled the following information.

CANADA PENSION PLAN

When an Old Age Security (OAS) and Canada Pension Plan (CPP) beneficiary dies, their benefits must be cancelled. Benefits are payable for the month in which the death occurs; benefits received after that will have to be repaid.

Please have the Social Insurance Number ready if you call.

LAND TITLE & SURVEY AUTHORITY OF BC

If there is real estate in joint title with the deceased, the property will need to be re-registered. The land title office will need to see an original death certificate.
